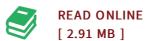

The number of corporations taxed has increased from year to year both through discovering new corporations under the old provisions of the law, and by adding new classes of corporations. License fees on foreign corporations were imposed in 1895, and still later saving banks were brought under the provisions of the statute. In 1912, report blanks were sent out to over 40,000 separate corporations. The work connected with the taxation of so many corporations grew from that which could be performed by one clerk to a volume that required a large office force. In 1912 the corporation tax bureau employed sixteen salaried officials, including examiners located in the offices at New York and Buffalo. One reason the law worked so well was that large powers were conferred upon the comptroller in the matter of securing...
